Service - Vespers

- **L** But the wicked will perish;
- the enemies of the LORD are like the glory of the pastures; they vanish—like smoke they vanish away.

- but the righteous is generous and gives;
- **L** for those blessed by the LORD shall inherit the land,
- but those cursed by him shall be cut off.
- **L** The steps of a man are established by the LORD,
- when he delights in his way;
- **L** though he fall, he shall not be cast headlong,
- for the LORD upholds his hand.
- L I have been young, and now am old,
- g yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken or his children begging for bread.
- **L** He is ever lending generously,
- and his children become a blessing.
- **I** Turn away from evil and do good;
- **G** so shall you dwell forever.
- **L** For the LORD loves justice;
- he will not forsake his saints.
- **L** They are preserved forever,
- but the children of the wicked shall be cut off.
- **I** The righteous shall inherit the land
- and dwell upon it forever.
- **L** The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom,
- **and his tongue speaks justice.**
- **I** The law of his God is in his heart;
- his steps do not slip.

- **I** The wicked watches for the righteous
- and seeks to put him to death.
- **L** The LORD will not abandon him to his power
- or let him be condemned when he is brought to trial.
- L Wait for the LORD and keep his way,
- and he will exalt you to inherit the land; you will look on when the wicked are cut off.
- **I** I have seen a wicked, ruthless man,
- spreading himself like a green laurel tree.
- L But he passed away, and behold, he was no more;
- though I sought him, he could not be found.
- L Mark the blameless and behold the upright,
- for there is a future for the man of peace.
- **L** But transgressors shall be altogether destroyed;
- the future of the wicked shall be cut off.
- **L** The salvation of the righteous is from the LORD;
- he is their stronghold in the time of trouble.
- **L** The LORD helps them and delivers them;
- **G** he delivers them from the wicked and saves them, because they take refuge in him.

¹"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. ²"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ³But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.


Prayer for Peace
